We loved getting to see all the siblings together in their wedding party. With only Samuel still at home, it is rare to spend time with all four at once! (James lives nearby; Sarah is at college.) In July, Ken officiated his first funeral as the **Family Milestones** Jack family gathered in North Carolina for his Dad's memorial. It was the first time Ken's siblings had all been together since another family funeral in 2002. Ken's mother "snowbirds" now, living with us spring through Thanksgiving; her heart to serve is a blessing to many!

In November, the two of us enjoyed a week out of the country to celebrate our 25th anniversary. (We went a month early for the better weather.) It was the kind of adventure we hadn't done (without kids) since our honeymoon!

We are finally settled in a church that feels like home! Ken and other guys from "Redeemer" go monthly to speak at Milwaukee Rescue Mission; one gentleman there even prayed with him to receive Christ as Savior! Andrea has been volunteering in children's ministry during services and taught a couple times recently. Back in the spring, Samuel went on a missions trip with the youth group; this fall he is helping with an afterschool Bible study.

Ministry Moments it has been 18 years since transferring from Papua New Guinea to our mission board's Bible Institute in the U.S.! Ken and I still serve primarily in Maintenance and Childcare.
