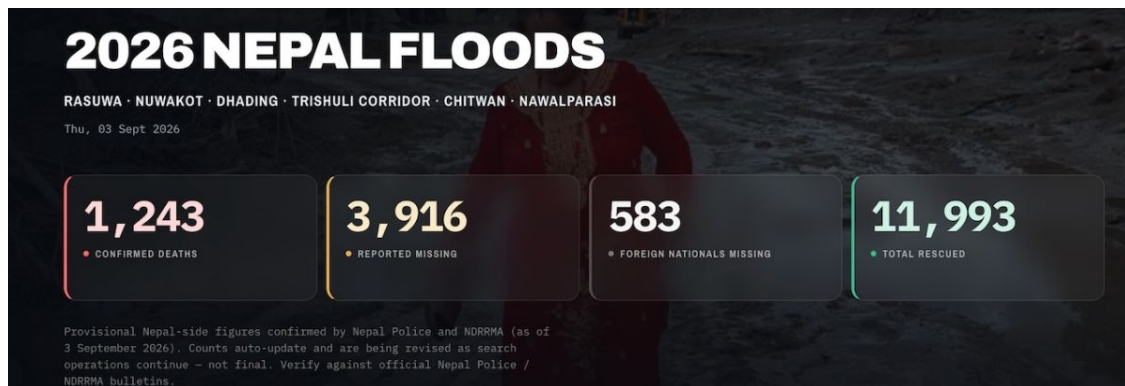


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Publicly please keep my name separate from the area.



Its Hard to Fathom

I'm sure most everyone has heard of the incredible landslide and flooding disaster that has hit Nepal. Watching the many images on-line as things progressed has been heart-breaking to say the least. I wouldn't have believed this much could happen this quickly. I won't post links here, but if you want to understand more just start looking on-line. You can also check out my Facebook for some options. Even though we are more than a week past the initial episode, things are still a long long way from settled down. When you see the pictures, you can understand why. On top of this was a landslide much further down (started from the flooding) that has left the most majorly used highway heading west out of Kathmandu to literally disappear in a gap that can not be breached or gone around. Obviously the number of lives lost is incredible, and so many may never be found. But infrastructure, such as houses, businesses, schools, roads, bridges, hydroelectric projects, phone systems, and electricity have all been hit very very hard. Just getting to the places that need help and aid is and will be incredibly difficult. Much less to think of the years it will take to rebuild, if it even can be done. This has certainly been a disaster that makes it clear how tenuous life on earth can be.

I don't know anyone personally from the affected areas, and have not had much connection with that area of the country. But news is gradually flowing in of 'connections' from friends of friends, etc. We had an on-line intercession meeting last night with the women, and able to talk to one of the planters' wives from an affected district, but thankfully they were not directly affected. I had one message of a list of Bodies in the areas, with how many dead and several buildings damaged. A couple seemed to indicate that possibly almost all the members were gone. The grief is beyond understanding.
